

Dear Parishioners. Readers of the "Irish Catholic" will be familiar with Fr Ronald Rolheiser

OMI, who offers a weekly column on a variety of interesting topics. During the Christmas break I managed to read one of his books - "Prayer - Our Deepest Yearning". Published by Franciscan Media, this short, readable book offers a very clear and realistic reflection on the challenges and opportunities of making prayer part of daily living. Rolheiser suggests that most of us don't pray because we are malicious, or lazy or disinterested – most days we don't get around to it because we are so busy. "We live in a world of instant and constant communications, of mobile phones and e-mails, of iPods that contain whole libraries of music, of television packages that contain hundreds of channels and of shopping centres that stay open all night with sounds that never die and lights that never go out". He goes on to say that, "Typically our day is so full (of work, noise, pressure, rush) that when we do finally get home and have some time when we could shut down all the stimulation, we are so fatigued that what soothes us is something that functions as a narcotic: a sporting event, a game show on television, a mindless sitcom, or anything that can calm our tensions and relax us enough to sleep. It's not bad if we do this on a given night, but it is bad when we do it every night". He goes on to suggest that very often we never find space in our lives to touch what's deepest inside of us and inside of others. And given the power of our culture, we could go along like this for years until something stops us in our tracks – a loved one dies, someone breaks our heart, the doctor tells us we have a terminal disease. Then, he believes, we are forced to look into our own depth, and that can be a frightening abyss if we have spent years avoiding it. To quote him directly, "Sometimes we need a narcotic. But we have to know when it is time to unplug the television, turn off the phone, shut down the computer, silence the iPod, lay away the sports page, and resist going out for a drink with a friend, so that, for one moment at least, we are not avoiding making friends with that one part of us, the deepest part, that someday will accompany us into the sunset."
