Dear Parishioners,

George Orwell's famous novel "Animal Farm" was published in 1945. Written as a satire, it was intended to mock the brutal dictatorship of Russian Communism. Set in a world where there are no rules, no laws, where nobody holds positions of authority or responsibility, it is supposed to be the ideal society. This was to be Utopia, where everything would go along smoothly, nobody would rock the boat and everybody would live happily ever after. Unfortunately, things don't turn out that way. Although the novel is about animals, the point of the story is that, without structures, without rules to guide behaviour, without somebody taking responsibility to animate and lead the group, we also can descend into anarchy and self-destruction. The reality is: 'All animals are equal - but some are more equal than others'

In today's Gospel we learn that Jesus doesn't want to do away with the law; rather he wants to fulfil it. He does not, however, want the law to become an end in itself. The law is there to serve the people, to guide and protect them, and it must not be used to control them or oppress them. Jesus tells us that all law comes from God and, therefore, for a law to be valid, it must be made for the common good. Jesus is more in favour of a law of love, rather than a love of law.

The journey towards perfection is a slow process. Therefore, I am becoming perfect when I show a little more patience towards those with whom I have to live even though it may test my serenity; a little more firmness to continue the work which duty demands even though it may be unpleasant; a little more common sense to take people as they are; a little more strength to endure an event that disturbs my peace; a little more cheerfulness so as not to show I am hurt; and a little more prayerfulness to draw God to my heart.

A blind man slowly turned the corner of a busy street feeling his way with his white cane. A young man coming from the opposite direction bumped into him. "Why don't you look where you're going?" barked the young man. The blind man gently replied, "Why don't you go where you are looking?"

May the words of the Gospel give us vision and guide our steps.
