Dear Parishioners

This feast invites us to reflect on God's most special gift to us and a timely reminder to renew our faith and deepen our appreciation of the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. He is the living bread sent down from heaven as food for our souls, to satisfy our spiritual hunger. The Eucharist proclaims that Jesus died for our sins so that we might have life and salvation. The Son of God could not have given us a greater proof of his love for us and of his desire to be with us always, until the end of time.

As pilgrims on the road of life we experience many hungers but the greatest hunger of all is the longing for a deeper meaning to life. In that search, the Eucharist is of great help because it is an invitation to follow in the footsteps of Jesus. By joining him on the road he travelled and by doing our best to imitate his life of caring and sharing we are gradually brought to see the importance of placing the common good of all people before our own self-interest.

If sharing in the Eucharist is to mean more than going to Mass and receiving nourishment for our own personal spiritual lives, we must imitate Jesus and rise above the divisions and injustices of society, open the doors of our hearts and our homes and accept people as they are. The Eucharist calls us to live as brothers and sisters of Jesus and of each other. To fully participate in the Eucharist we need to be of a mind to forgive the friend who has hurt us or the neighbour who has let us down. For God's love to flow through us we need to be conscious and open channels of that love in all our dealings with other people. We are to go out and bless the lives of others, to be a healing, comforting presence, a helping hand, a voice of sympathy and a source of encouragement for all that is good, all that imitates the way of Jesus. In such ways we will be shaped and formed, blessed and renewed, by the Eucharist we celebrate. Then Jesus will be truly present to us in the sacrament – we will sense that he is there in the persons of those for whom we do good in his name.
