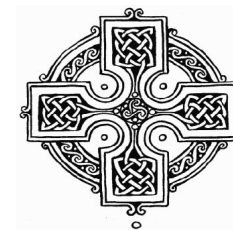

Dear Parishioners

In these days of indifference to the gospel message it is good to recall the instruction Jesus gave to his apostles as he prepared them for their mission. He wants us to hear those words as well, and to act on them. In so doing we share in his mission and, when life is over and our part of the mission is accomplished, he will claim us as his own before God the Father.
