Special Prayer Vigil in St Patrick's Cathedral, Armagh to celebrate "Red Wednesday"

"Aid to the Church in need" invites us to join on **Wed 22 Nov** to light up our Churches and wear something red as we remember Christian martyrs and those who have died for their faith. On that day, St Patrick's Cathedral, Armagh will be a blaze of red and people are asked to wear something red (a sweater, a cardigan, a jacket, a scarf or a tie) as a symbolic reminder of all those Christians who have suffered and died for their Christian faith over the years. Archbishop Eamon Martin will lead a special **Prayer Vigil in St Patrick's Cathedral at 8.30pm** on the eve of Red Wednesday. As part of the Vigil, people will have an opportunity to venerate and be blessed by special Relics of St Dymphna and St Oliver Plunkett, both of whom died for their faith.

As well as the special Prayer Vigil, special Masses will be offered in the Cathedral at 8am and 10am on **Wed 22 Nov** for all who have died for their faith over the years.

Dear Parishioners

The message of today's gospel is to make a great deal more of life, to tackle it positively and with enthusiasm, by reaching out beyond our own private world and sharing something of ourselves with others. It's worth remembering that true happiness and real satisfaction is often found in times when we are completely absorbed in doing something really worthwhile – and that usually involves other people rather than ourselves. In a real sense, we come closer to God when we help his kingdom to grow here on earth by the good and worthwhile things that we do.

On the other hand, failure to use our talents wisely and well can be caused by a false belief that we have little or nothing to offer. Today's gospel invites us to remind ourselves that God will reward us for faithfully carrying out our ordinary, everyday responsibilities. The ordinary deeds of care and consideration for others that we do almost as a natural habit are indeed important in the eyes of God. Few of us will be given the opportunity to do spectacular things, but let us never forget that our daily acts of decency and kindness, which we maybe regard as nothing special, really do count when God evaluates our lives.
