Dear Parishioners

The mysterious beginnings of evil in the world are poetically described in the familiar story of Adam and Eve's fall from grace in the Garden of Eden. It is a striking account of the way in which sin corrupts the relationship between God and people. God called out to Adam: "Where are you?" Adam hid because he was guilty and felt ashamed and embarrassed for what he had done in eating the forbidden fruit. With true human instinct Adam shifted the blame onto Eve, saying, "It was the woman you put with me: she gave me the fruit and I ate it". When Eve was confronted she blamed the serpent. The whole sorry episode is typical of the way we, as human beings, go about things and try to avoid accepting responsibility for our action. We have a built-in instinct to pass on the blame.

Sin creates distance between ourselves and God. We can make matters worse by a stubborn refusal to admit we were wrong. The more correct path is to acknowledge our sin and ask for God's forgiveness – the ability to say sorry in both words and actions is a vital part of any meaningful relationship. When God calls out to us "Where are you?" we are inclined to hide because we sense that God requires us to give an account of ourselves. But God, in equal measure, wants to give us forgiveness and mercy and love - and a fresh start. The entire life and mission of Jesus was about renewing and re-starting the relationship between God and each one of us. Why would we not keep ourselves open to that wonderful offer?
