### **The Annual Procession in honour of the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, to the Tall Cross of Clonoe**

This will be celebrated on **Mon 16 Sept** after the Novena at **7.30 p.m.** This procession is celebrated especially for everyone who at this time is carrying a particularly heavy cross. Each pilgrim will be given a little paper cross and a pen. They will then be invited to put the initials of someone who at this time is particularly burdened by sickness, addiction, grief, depression, anxiety, suicidal thoughts, financial worry or any other burden they may be weighed down by. They then carry their little initialled cross in procession from Clonoe Chapel to the Tall Cross where they lay the paper cross at the foot of the Tall Cross.
